Extend TA hours (7.5 hours extra x2)	To support identified targeted groups of students across both Key Stages, focusing on key skills and core subjects. Increase staff capacity and maximise contact time.	Enable targeted students to catch up on lost learning. Targeted intervention sessions aimed at narrowing the gaps which were exacerbated by the pandemic should help reduce learning gaps. GL assessments will be used at KS3 to help quantify impact. Online Tutoring (NTP)	Enable targeted students to have access to 15 hours of online tutoring to boost their progress and confidence to help them reduce learning gaps in preparation for teacher assessment and GCSEs	Students will have gained knowledge and confidence, reducing the difference between their minimum expected target grade and actual attainment.
