### Update for Year 9 Families

As you are aware, since the return to school after the Easter holidays, we have been working hard to reinforce our expectations for all aspects of the school's behaviour policy. In the first of our 'fortnightly focus' periods on uniform and equipment, we have seen a huge increase in the number of students wearing the correct uniform and footwear and therefore meeting our guidelines, as well as students bringing vital equipment which means that the start to lessons is not delayed and progress can be maximised. I would like to ask for your continued support in ensuring that students have the full, correct uniform and discussing with your children any sanctions that they may receive for uniform and how they can avoid them in the future. If you have particular circumstances which mean it is difficult to obtain the correct uniform at the present time, please contact your child's Head of Year in the first instance.

Our next fortnightly focus begins tomorrow, with a drive on attendance and punctuality. As new guidance suggests we need to learn to live with Coronavirus, and absences relating to this are necessary solely for students who are unwell with a high temperature, we would like to support our students to achieve their attendance targets. We have noticed a significant increase in the numbers of students who arrive late to school and this must be avoided at all costs. The tutor time programme delivers statutory education and students must be **in tutor time by 8.40am**. Please remind your child to arrive at school and go **through the school gates by 8.35am**. Students who arrive on time are rewarded with stamps on the gate which can be traded for rewards ranging from a new pen up to a £20 Xbox voucher and much more inbetween! Students who arrive late enter school through the dining hall door and are given a late code; three late codes result in a 30-minute detention. Arriving 10 minutes late to school each day adds up to over 31 hours of schooling missed and no student can afford to do this, so I would like to ask for your support in ensuring your child arrives to school on time each day.

Parent voice is extremely important to us and we are working hard in school to improve in this area. As you may recall, we recently held an election for the position of Parent Governor on our Local Governing Committee. I am delighted to let you know that the position has been filled and Mr Darren Leppington has been elected to the Committee. Further to the Edurio survey, we are continually looking for more ways to communicate with you about life in school and to listen to your feedback. We held a GPS Parents' Forum last week on the theme of safeguarding and our next Parents' Forum takes place on **Wednesday 8 June at 6pm**; this begins with an introduction to the teaching and
