

## **SAFEGUARDING NEWSLETTER – SUMMER 2022**

At George Pindar School we are continually working to support students in feeling safe and well at school and to enable them to flourish both within and outside of school.

Within school, Mr Murray and Miss Pickles lead the safeguarding and pastoral support alongside the Heads of Year and Form Tutors to offer guidance when needed to all of our students and their parents/carers where appropriate.

We have developed our relationships with the various external agencies to provide additional guidance and support – including the Sidewalk Youth Project, NY Youth Mentoring, NHS North Yorkshire, North Yorkshire Police, Compass Phoenix, Early Help and CAMHS to name but a few services we work with.



As we head into (hopefully) warmer weather, it is important to be aware of the dangers of water.

Each year around 400 people drown in the UK, a large proportion of these are younger people and teenagers.

The Royal Life Saving Society UK have prepared a video outlining how drowning can be prevented:

## Drowning - Don't let it be you

This message is especially important considering the number of beaches, lakes and ponds in the area.

Students will be shown this video in school and we encourage parents/carers to discuss these dangers with their children.





Unfortunately, it has come to the school's attention that a number of students using Tik Tok are putting themselves at unnecessary risk online – posting videos of themselves, sometimes under inappropriate topics, whilst wearing the school uniform.

It goes without saying that this behaviour can attract negative attention to the individuals involved- it wouldn't take much time for a stranger to work out where George Pindar School is.

We urge students to keep themselves safe online:

- Only post material that is suitable (think 'would I be happy showing my Gran this?').
- Never give out personal details.
- Consider who are you are talking to?
- Keep your device and social media **secure**.
- Never share passwords, not even with friends
