Dear Parent / Carer

We hope you and your child are enjoying the summer holidays. As we enter the final fortnight of summer, I write to provide a very brief update on some staffing changes and to confirm arrangements for September.

As the new year approaches, I would like to remind all families of our clear expectations regarding uniform. The full details are found here: https://qps.hslt.academy/uniform/ and there are no changes from information provided throughout the last academic year. As a reminder, students must wear:

- · A plain white shirt with school tie
- A black blazer with school badge
- A grey slipover with school badge (students in Year 11 may wear the black version)
- A tie with grey/blue/gold stripes (students in Year 11 may wear the black version)
- Black tailored trousers straight leg traditional style which must be loose at the ankle
- Pleated black skirt (no pencil skirts or tight-fitting skirts) worn with black tights (some older students may wear the old school kilt)
- Plain black flat leather or leather look shoes or plain black trainers (no visible logos or other colour).

Students are permitted to wear one pair of stud earrings; all other piercings and jewellery must be removed before arriving at school and clear retainers can be worn. Hair should be a natural colour and style. False eyelashes, false nails and excessive make-up are not permitted. Please note that <u>all</u> students return to school on <u>Tuesday 3 September at 8.40am</u>. All students use the main student entrance on Moor Lane. Gates open at 8.35am with breakfast club available from 8.10am every day. Our revised school day begins in September with tutor time beginning at 8.45am and school ending at 3.15pm every day.
