Message from the Principal

I can hardly believe that the half term holidays are already here - the last six weeks have flown by in school and have been particularly busy for staff due to our recent Ofsted inspection. I hope you have managed to read the report which was emailed to you yesterday. We are very proud of the improvements which have been recognised and ready to tackle the areas for improvement. We need your help to improve student attendance and hope that you can encourage your child to attend every day - students need to be in, to win! We are looking forward to the next half term and seeing all our students on **Monday 24th February 2025** at **8.40am**. I hope you all have a lovely half term break.

Attendance Matters

Evidence shows clearly that students who maintain higher attendance achieve higher grades and here at George Pindar School we want to encourage every child to attend as much as possible! The Government's 'Education Hub' released some data recently showing that in 2019, secondary school pupils who didn't achieve grade 9 to 4 in English and maths missed 10 more days on average over the key stage than those who achieved grade 9 to 5 in both English and maths.

Being in school is important to a child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development and every moment in school counts, and days missed add up quickly. The higher a pupil's attendance, the more they are likely to learn, and the better they are likely to perform in exams and formal assessments. At George Pindar School, students who achieve 100% each week are given a ticket to enter the '100 Club' prize draw and they can drop these in the attendance rewards cabinet for a chance to win gaming, shopping or Amazon vouchers at the end of the next half term. Students should aim for 100% every week when we return to school because attendance truly matters. We are currently working on some additional attendance competitions so please tell your child to keep a close eye on announcements in tutor time!

If for any reason your child is too ill for school, or if you have booked a holiday, it is incredibly important to update us in the morning. The five years of secondary school pass by very quickly and with our PINDAR value of Aspirational firmly in mind, we ensure we run a fantastic programme of careers-based activities at George Pindar School. In February our Year 9 students took part in a fantastic workshop provided by NYBEP and Jackson Civil Engineering, learning about routes into engineering careers and using problem solving skills to look into the future of engineering. A very different career was considered during the Achieve visit to Scarborough Town Hall where Zakon Business & Training Consultancy ran a Crime Scene to Courtroom experience for our students - this offered an incredible insight into the world of law for our students and was enjoyed by everyone!
